CONTENT OF THEMATIC DAYS

CRIMEAN TATAR DAY

July 5th, young participants of the camp plunged into the diverse culture of the Crimean Tatars. The main idea of the day was to visit the interactive museum of Crimea. Each location was devoted to a separate city, in particular: Bakhchisarai, where children were able to listen to the Crimean Tatar legends and fairy tales, while enjoying the fragrant Baklava and cacao, together mastered the art of the Crimean Tatar ethnic ornament in the city of Kerch, tried national costumes in the city of Eski Kirim, and sung ethnic songs together in the city of Kafa. The tour ended in the city of Gezlyov where everyone danced Haitarma.



ROMANIAN DAY

July 11th was devoted to the national Romanian holiday — Dragobethe, the day of lovers. Everyone had the opportunity to write a postcard of love declaration written in Romanian language, to find the soulmate using ethnic beliefs, to dance the traditional dance with a broom and sing the songs.

ARMENIAN DAY/GREEK DAY

July 24th was a day of theatrical transformations and festival in the camp for teenagers. The participants found out about Sergey Paradzhanov, Charle Aznaur, Olexander Harutyunyan, Vanush Hanemeryan, Ivan Ayvazovsky, talked about their contribution to the culture of Ukraine.

10th of July, July, a tour to the city of Lviv was organized for the younger children. The children had a very energetic and interesting quest to the Armenian and Greek sites of Lviv. As part of the tasks they were singing the lyrical songs, translating their name into Greek or finding the Greek roots there. They attended the palace of the famous merchant Konstantin Kornyakta and looked for the Greek and the Armenian architecture on the streets of Lviv. There was also a dancing flash mob in front of the Lviv Opera House dedicated to the Lviv Greek community, joined by a number of Lviv citizens.

LITHUANIAN DAY

July 9th was the day of the feast of Lithuanian ethnic holidays and festivities, such as Kaledos, Yoninis, Uzhgavinis, Atvelikos. The result of the day was the throwing of wreaths and a general roundelay.





POLISH DAY

For teenagers, it started on July 25th, as a traditional Polish fairy tale that introduced the features of the language and its interesting facts. The evening event was at the same time a quest, a puzzle and a creative workshop, resulting in the drawing of a map of Poland and Ukraine.

Younger children, on July 8th, found out about cultural traits of Poles residing in the territory of Ukraine, with their traditional dishes, costumes, songs and dances. The main motto of the day was an indivisible connection and mutual influence of Polish and Ukrainian culture.

DAY OF RUSSIAN CULTURE IN UKRAINE

July 23rd was remembered by delicious delicacies — pancakes, as well as a new perspective of the familiar characters of the Russian fairy tales and folk songs. In the evening, the children performed a «The Princess Frog» fairy tale in the form of a western, fantasy, action film, melodrama, etc. The day ended with the flashback — the Disco music from 90's.





ROMAN DAY

On July 12, all younger children became representatives of the Roma community. They tasted the national dishes, tried roman costumes and performed soul romances, learned how to understand the language by watching the folk cartoons.

On July 27th, an important aspect of the day for teenagers was a discussion of current challenges that representatives of the Roma community face in Ukraine. The participants immersed into the history and its terrible page, the genocide of the Roma, trying to overcome the existing stereotypes about the ethnic Roma community. The end of the day was a bright action of the common dance in the form of a Roma wheel, a national emblem of the Roma people.

BULGARIAN DAY

On this day, on July 13th, the younger children visited Tricky Peter, the hero of Bulgarian fairy-tales and legends, who hospitably treated everyone with the sweets and talked about the traits of Bulgarian culture, Bulgarian way of living and family values. The end of the day was marked by the staging of Bulgarian folk tales.





On July 20th, the teenagers discussed historical aspects of the appearance of Bulgarians in the territory of modern Ukraine, tracked the whole historical path of Bulgarian community development in our country, found out about national cuisine and learned the cultural features of Bulgarians and Ukrainians. The day ended with the creation of a live map of Ukraine and Bulgaria.

JEWISH DAY

For the younger children, the day of July 7th was devoted to familiarizing with the traditions of Jews in Ukraine through Jewish holidays, traditional cuisine, costumes, songs and dances, making them closer and more understandable. In the evening, the whole camp traditionally celebrated Shabbat, according to the Jewish tradition, with candles, grape juice and traditional challahs.

For teenagers the day of July 21st began with a morning dance with a contemporary Jewish music. The flag of Israel was carried while the Israeli anthem Hatikvah was playing. Among the educational locations were: Chuppah — a traditional Jewish wedding, Shabbat, where everyone learned how to bake halis. Children were particularly interested in the classes about main symbols of the Jewish people: Torah, Menorah, Siddur and Kippah. They learned the songs as «Hava Nagila» and «Toda», and enthusiastically danced «Adama Veshamaim».



GERMAN DAY

On July 8th, the younger children along with trainers were able to immerse into the culture of the Germans in Ukraine, to learn the songs and dances, take part in the debates, and learn more about German art and hand-painted the fragments of Berlin Wall. In the evening, the camp participants performed Germans and showed their theatrical comics scenes. The end of the day was marked by a Disco with kvass and sausages.

UKRAINIAN DAY

Ukrainian day is always one of the brightest and unforgettable ones because it's the day when representatives of all ethnic communities living in Ukraine unite under the single slogan «Our dear Homeland».

On July 6th, the younger children immersed into the world of outstanding Ukrainian inventors who influenced the course of world history. They discussed the topic of the Cossack State, decorated the gingerbread with traditional ornaments and finished the day singing contemporary Ukrainian songs.

For teenagers, the topic of the day day on July 28th was «The prominent cultural figures of the 20th century». Les Kurbas, Mikhail Semenko and others have become closer to the teens thanks to the exciting world of their creativity. In the evening the participants of «Source of Tolerance» presented a collection of little-known poetry by Mikhail Semenko with their own creative design.

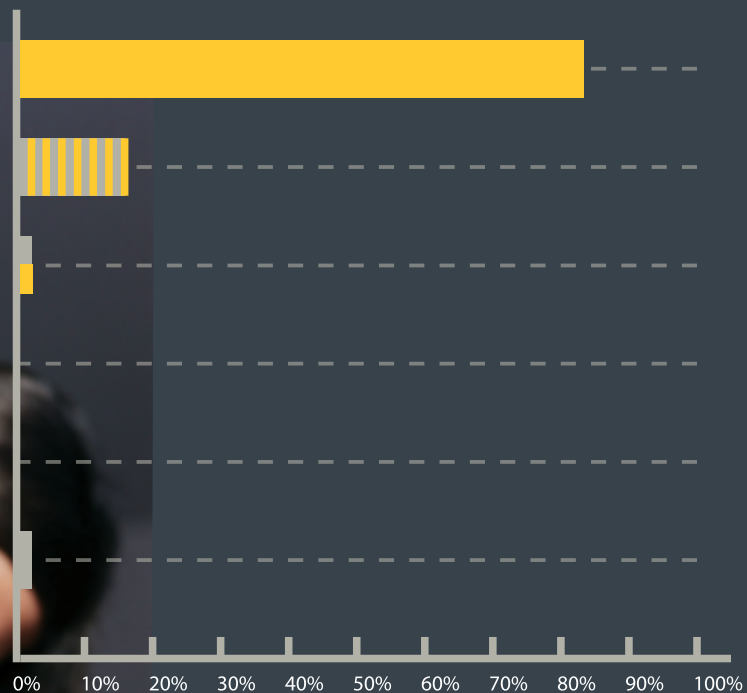

In January 2017, the Congress of Ethnic Communities of Ukraine began to implement the project of monitoring of research and practices of counteraction to anti-Semitism and Romaphobia.

CONTENT OF THE PROJECT:

The project analyzes the factors that can influence the manifestation of anti-Semitism and Romaphobia, in particular, in terms of existing legislation, media policy, social processes, implementation of existing strategies and programs, and practices for preventing and reacting to such manifestations

The project will demonstrate the real scale of the anti-Semitism and Romaphobia, problems in Ukraine and will reach the attention of the authorities and the general public.

PROJECT EVENTS INCLUDE:

- Advanced analysis of Ukrainian legislation in counteraction to discrimination and xenophobia (in relation to Jewish representatives and the Roma community as well)
- Gathering materials on the manifestations of anti-Semitism and Romaphobia, or their prevention
- Analysis of existing research, strategies, projects and programs on the project subject
- Analysis of the hate speech in the media
- In-depth interviews with the leaders of Jewish and Roma communities, as well as representatives of related NGOs
- Organization of roundtables in Lviv, Kharkiv and Kiev to discuss the current project issues with the civil society and present the reports.

THE FOCUS OF THE PROJECT

is to highlight the real facts and develop the most specific and effective recommendations for different target groups that have real impact on the problem solving
